<p><b>Clue #1: Where it all began</b> Orange Lawrence, the Town's founder stands proudly in front of Town Hall. He stands over 7 feet tall and is ready to work, with plans in hand. How many buttons are on his vest?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #2: Name that animal</b> Take a look around the windows of Orangeville's historic Town Hall to find evidence that the building once functioned as a market area. A tree sculpture entitled The Musicians plays tribute to the Blues &amp; Jazz Festival. Name one of the two instruments being played.</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #4: Written in the stars</b> The window of Suzanne Gardner Flowers is filled with enough lush greenery to live up every visit to downtown Orangeville. <p><b>Clue #5: Falling leaves</b> Reader's Choice is a used book store that has been open in downtown Orangeville for over 20 years. The storefront showcases more than just the impressive selection of books. What type of leaves are featured on the façade?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #6: Find it in the façade</b> The historic façade of Sproule's Emporium is hard to miss. The business has been part of Orangeville's community for over 40 years. Today, the store offers fair trade products, but a different type of business used to be located here. What was it?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #7: Perk up</b> Mochaberry is a cozy café that serves up in-house roasted coffee, delicious food, and the best in service and quality. On the café's sign, you'll find both beans and berries, representing the ingredients that go into their signature brews. How many individual red berries can you see?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #8: Meet the moose</b> Standing outside Dragonfly Arts on Broadway, you'll find a sculpture of a moose. Installed in 2005, the unique sculpture is made out of a recycled oil tank. On the side of the building, find a plaque bearing the building's namesake. <p><b>Clue #13: Timely thank you</b> The marble clock standing in the middle of Broadway weighs about 907 kg and was originally installed on the Town's former post office in 1936. Find a plaque with a timely thank you. How many donors contributed to the restoration project?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #14: Buns in the oven</b> At Son of a Chef Bakery, you'll enjoy daily specials along with fresh bread, cakes, and baked goods. Before you dig in, take a look at the sign. How many stalks of wheat do you see?</p> <p>Answer: _____</p>	<p><b>Clue #15: Hear me roar</b> There is a lion loose on Broadway! Find the elusive tree sculpture and take a photo showing how you can roar like a lion.</p> <p>Share @orangevilletourism</p>	<p><b>Clue #16: Find the farmer</b> A tree sculpture called Sesquicentennial was carved for the Town's 150th birthday in 2013.
